# Survey of Likely 2026 General Election Voters Pennsylvania State Senate District 6

February 26 – 27, 2025 | n=305 | ±5.60%

### **Insights & Analysis**

- Support for adult use cannabis is considerable with 70% of voters overall saying they support it and 45% saying they strongly support it. Only one-in-four are in opposition (25%).
  - Voters under the age of 44 support regulated adult use cannabis the most; still more than 60% across all age brackets support it.
  - More than half of Trump 2024 voters (52%) support adult use cannabis and more Republicans strongly support (30%) it than those who strongly oppose (27%).
  - More non-college educated men (72-20%) support regulated cannabis than college educated men (67-31%).
  - Support is highest in the Southeast (76-20%) area of the district while support is 10% lower in the Northwest (66-28%) area.
  - Messaging further solidifies support with young voters and Republicans see a 6% net-shift towards support as well.
- In a district that he won by 6%, Donald Trump's image is 43% favorable and 54% unfavorable with more than half having a very unfavorable impression of him (51%).
- Josh Shapiro has a favorable image with nearly two-thirds of voters (62%). A considerable number of Republicans (42%) have a favorable impression of Shapiro; thought just 15% are very favorable (27% somewhat favorable).




### **Insights & Analysis**

- Frank Farry's image is 27% favorable and 16% unfavorable while a plurality have never heard of him (34%).
  - Most Republicans who have heard of him have a favorable impression of him (41-6%) and his among Independent voters is solid (25-16%).
  - His favorables are strongest in the Southeast (32-17%) area while his name identification trails in the Northwest (39% never heard of) area.
- Double the number of voters would **support the re-election for a legislator that voted for adult use cannabis** (18%) than those who would **vote them out** (9%). A third (35%) say they would consider their entire record while almost the same number (29%) say it would make no difference.
- The Economy message rates the highest overall while the Judicial Fairness message sees the most voters say they strongly agree.
  - Regression analysis shows that Broad Support is most effective at changing the mind of voters to support adult use cannabis. It is also the most effective message with Republicans and Independents.
  - Democrats are most persuaded by the Economy and Crime messages.





### Messages

**Safety:** Legalizing recreational marijuana will enhance public health and safety by providing adult consumers the ability to purchase regulated products in dispensaries. There is currently over \$1 billion in illegal sales that could be put into a legally regulated market, allowing for the government to reinvest in Pennsylvania's communities, and create thousands of new jobs.



It's an issue that unites people across the political spectrum, with leaders from President Donald Trump to Governor Josh Shapiro supporting legalization. 
